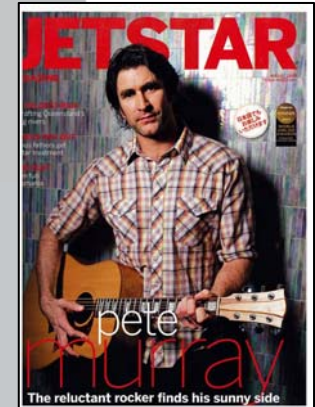

Great place for dinner:

Raquel's Spanish Kitchen on Oxford Street, Darlinghurst, or Toko on Crown Street in Surry Hills for its great Japanese food and atmosphere. Make sure to book for both.

Best place to party with the gang:

Start at the Marble Bar at the Hilton, followed by the GPO bar and then hit Oxford St: The Gaff, Q Bar and Stonewall are all perfect for a few drinks, a game of pool and lots of dancing.

I'm scared of heights so the Harbour Bridge climb was just terrifying. It was well worth it, but I won't be doing it again!



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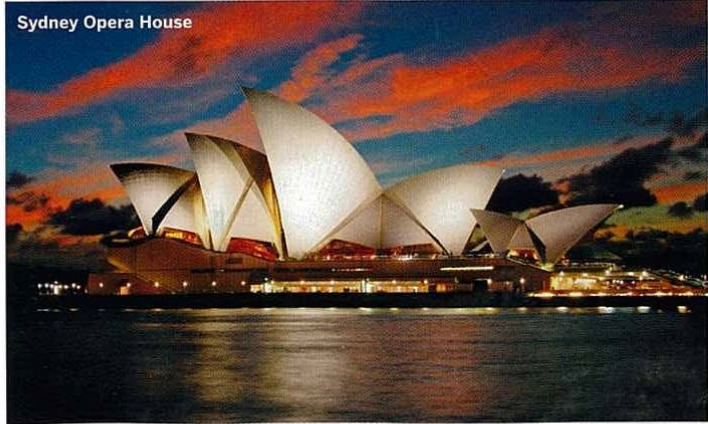
